DIRECTIONS TO THE CONNECTICUT STATE CAPITOL

The State Capitol is located at 210 Capitol Avenue, Hartford, CT

Traveling I-84 East

Take Exit 48, Capitol Avenue, get into the left lane of the exit ramp and follow the signs for Asylum Street.

At the end of the exit ramp, turn right onto Asylum Street, continue bearing right until you come to Pulaski Circle and take another right onto Elm Street.

Follow Elm Street to the traffic light, at the traffic light proceed across Trinity Street directly onto the Capitol grounds.

Traveling I-84 West

Take Exit 48, Asylum Street, at the end of the exit ramp, turn left at the light onto Asylum Street.

Get into the right lane and go under the railroad bridge.

Continue bearing right until you come to Pulaski Circle and take another right onto Elm Street.

Follow Elm Street to the traffic light, at the traffic light proceed across Trinity Street directly onto the Capitol grounds.

Traveling I-91 North or South

Take Exit 29A, Capitol Ave, follow the highway along to Pulaski Circle, go halfway around the circle and exit to the right onto Elm Street.

Follow Elm Street to the traffic light, at the traffic light proceed across Trinity Street directly onto the Capitol grounds.

Parking

Limited public parking is available in the spaces immediately upon entering the grounds; On-street metered parking and commercial parking lots are also nearby.
